<p>POLICIES</p>	
<p>Attendance policy</p>	<p>The student has to attend 100% of practical classes and 60% of lectures. In case of missed classes, the student has to rework the missed class in accordance with the schedule of reworking approved by the department, and in the presence of the order of the dean's office.</p>

<p>Assessment policy</p>	<p>On every practical class the student gets one mark for computer testing or theoretical interrogation on 4-point system. Prescriptions written test is assessed as "passed" or not "passed". The marks set according to the traditional scale are converted into points according to the scale of conversion of traditional marks into rating points. The student gets a semester test (for 5-th semester) on the last lesson of the discipline based on the results of the current assessments. The minimal grade score for the current educational activities of the student is 120, the maximal - 200 points. Students with an overage grade score lower than 3 (less than 120) for the 5th semester have to upgrade it at last class by taking computer- testing according to the thematic plan of the 5th semester topics. The student will successfully take the test if he gets et least 18 correct answers out of 30 questions of 24 out of 40. In this case, student will get average semester grade "3" = 120 points. The exam is held according to the schedule at the end of the 6th semester. The student is allowed to take exam , if student makes requirements of the curriculum, completes all types of planned educational work: successful testing "Step-1", writing annual prescriptions, implementation of all ODZ and protocols for each practical lesson and if he gets for the current educational activity at least 72 points. Exam tickets contain 3 theoretical questions on various topics and cover all sections of the discipline. The exam is credited to the student if he gets at least 48 points out of 80. Incentive points are added to the grade for the discipline for participation in interuniversity competitions (7-12 points depending on the degree), participation in intra-university competitions (2-5 points depending on the prize)), implementation of an individual research project (abstracts 2 points). The total score in the discipline may not exceed 200 points.</p>
<p>Deadlines and course retake policy</p>	<p>In case of fail exam, the student has the right to retake the semester exam twice, the first time - to the examiner appointed by the head of the department, the second - to the commission created by the dean's office. The re-examination is carried out according to the schedule approved by the dean's office. Students who fail to take the exam without good reason are considered to have received an unsatisfactory grade. The student's refusal to perform the examination tasks is certified as an unsatisfactory answer. The student has the right to receive an explanation of the grade obtained.</p>
<p>Assessment appeals policy</p>	<p>The results of the module and semester assessment are subject to appeal. A student must lodge an appeal to the director/dean on the day of certification or after announcing the results, but no later than the next working day. The appeal commission is established by the director/dean's order. The appeal commission's decision may change the grade in case of violations revealed during the attestation.</p>

Academic integrity policy	<p>Participants must complete all tasks according to the course requirements independently. Participants are not allowed to cheat during the written module or summative test. The assignments should not contain plagiarism, facts of fabrication, falsification, cheating. Manifestations of other types of academic dishonesty determined by the Academic Integrity policy are also unacceptable. If a teacher reveals violations of academic integrity by students during the course, the former have the right to take one of the following actions: - to reduce points by up to 40% for practical assignments; - to give recommendations for improving and resubmitting mandatory homework assignments with the reduction of points by up to 25%; - to not accept mandatory homework assignments without the right to resubmit; - set a date for retaking the written module or the summative test with a reduction of points by up to 15%; - to not allow to retake the written module or the summative test.</p>
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
