<p><b>POLICIES</b></p>	
<p><b>Attendance policy</b></p>	<p>FMC is conducted after studying all topics and ending of all practical classes in writing with further oral discussion. FMC issues include control of student theoretical knowledge. Students are allowed to pass FMC, if all types of activities from educational program of the discipline are completed, namely: • attended all classes; • worked out all missed classes in-time; • scored the minimum number of points for course achievement (not less than 72, that equals "3" in the national scale).</p>

<p><b>Assessment policy</b></p>	<p>The maximum number of points a student can receive in practical classes during academic year is 200. The following points are assigned for the research task: "5" - 12 points, "4" - 8 points, "3" - 6 points, "2" - 0 points.</p> <p>The maximum of points a student can according to the continuous assessment from all course is 120. Students are allowed to pass FMC, if all types of activities from educational program of the discipline are completed and if the score of continuous assessment not less than 72 point: 60 point for practical studies and 12 – for individual research project. Students who took part and gained awards at public health conferences are exempt from passing up a final module control with the maximum number of points (40 points). Control of the student's achievements and assessment are carried out according to the module and rating system. The form of final control of the subject is the final module control. • The maximum number of points a student can get for a FMC is 40. • The minimum number of points a student must score for a FMC is 24.</p>
<p><b>Deadline and course retake policy</b></p>	<p>Deadline and retesting terms are formed by the Dean Office.</p>
<p><b>Assessment appeals policy</b></p>	<p>The results of the module and semester assessment are subject to appeal. A student must lodge an appeal to the director/dean on the day of certification or after announcing the results, but no later than the next working day. The appeal commission is established by the director/dean's order. The appeal commission's decision may change the grade in case of violations revealed during the attestation.</p>

policy**

Participants must complete all tasks according to the course requirements independently. Participants are not allowed to cheat during the written module or summative test. The assignments should not contain plagiarism, facts of fabrication, falsification, cheating. Manifestations of other types of academic dishonesty determined by the Academic Integrity policy are also unacceptable. If a teacher reveals violations of academic integrity by students during the course, the former have the right to take one of the following actions:

- to reduce points by up to 40% for practical assignments;
- to give recommendations for improving and resubmitting mandatory homework assignments with the reduction of points by up to 25%;
- to not accept mandatory homework assignments without the right to resubmit;
- set a date for retaking the written module or the summative test with a reduction of points by up to 15%;
- to not allow to retake the written module or the summative test.
