POLICIES	
Attendance policy	The student must attend 100% of practical and 60% of lectures. In case of skipping classes, the student must work missed class according to the schedule of reworks, approved by the department in the presence of the relevant order of the dean's office.

<p>Assessment policy</p>	<p>Grade in the discipline is defined as the sum of points for the current educational activity (not less than 72) and points for the final modular control (not less than 48). Number of points for the current activity is calculated by the formula $100 \times \text{arithmetic mean student performance in the 4-point grading system} / 5$. By diagnostic testing the student receives a maximum of 10 points. The minimum number of points that a student must receive is 6 points. For the defense of the presentation the student receives a maximum of 10 points, minimum -6. The maximum number of points for the current student's educational activity - 120. The student is admitted to offset subject to the requirements of the curriculum and in the case if for the current educational activity he scored at least 72 points: 60 points during practical classes, 6 points for defense presentations and 6 points for testing Final modular control is carried out at the end of the academic semester in the form written test, with a score of "5" corresponds to 80 points, "4" - 64 points, "3" - 48 points, "2" - 0 points. In case of unsatisfactory the result for the final modular control the student has the right to reset the credit. Students who did not appear for the test without good reason are considered to have received unsatisfactory assessment. The student's refusal to perform the final the modular task is certified as an unsatisfactory answer.</p>
<p>Deadlines and course retake policy</p>	<p>In case the applicant received an unsatisfactory grade for practically - the focused differentiated offset, it should reschedule it at 19 or 21 weeks (depending on the semester study) in the form of testing. The maximum score you can to get the applicant for the final modular control (PMC) - "3". The grade from the discipline that the applicant receives after PMC rearrangement is defined as the sum of points for the current one success and 48 points for PMC. In case the applicant does not again rearranged PMC - the second rearrangement is carried out in the form testing in the presence of the commission. The maximum score he has can get for PM- "3". After the second rearrangement of PMC all current points received by the student in the discipline are canceled. Overall grade for the discipline that the student may receive after The 3rd rearrangement of the PMC cannot be more than the "3" that corresponds to 120 points. The applicant must reschedule the PMC to early next semester.</p>
<p>Assessment appeals policy</p>	<p>The results of the module and semester assessment are subject to appeal. A student must lodge an appeal to the director/dean on the day of certification or after announcing the results, but no later than the next working day. The appeal commission is established by the director/dean's order. The appeal commission's decision may change the grade in case of violations revealed during the attestation.</p>

Academic integrity policy	<p>Participants must complete all tasks according to the course requirements independently. Participants are not allowed to cheat during the written module or summative test. The assignments should not contain plagiarism, facts of fabrication, falsification, cheating. Manifestations of other types of academic dishonesty determined by the Academic Integrity policy are also unacceptable. If a teacher reveals violations of academic integrity by students during the course, the former have the right to take one of the following actions: - to reduce points by up to 40% for practical assignments; - to give recommendations for improving and resubmitting mandatory homework assignments with the reduction of points by up to 25%; - to not accept mandatory homework assignments without the right to resubmit; - set a date for retaking the written module or the summative test with a reduction of points by up to 15%; - to not allow to retake the written module or the summative test.</p>
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
